


This annual report presents all RID activities from the 2022 calendar year. Certain publications, funding, and presentations from the past year are highlighted below. A comprehensive list of activities begins on page 6.

Publications

Members of the RID team published 19 journal articles in 2022. These peer-reviewed articles covered numerous topics related to infection in pregnancy, vaccination, STIs, and more.



Of our 19 publications, we had one commentary article, one protocol, two scientific recommendations, three systematic reviews or meta-analyses, and twelve original research articles.



A highlight of our work this year was our publication in the Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA), titled "Association of SARS-CoV-2 Infection During Pregnancy With Maternal and Perinatal Outcomes". This publication provided evidence that SARS-CoV-2 infection during pregnancy is significantly associated with an increased risk of adverse

maternal outcomes and preterm birth. **The article was viewed over 50,000 times on the publisher's website and was shared on Twitter by over 500 people**, which landed it in the top 5% of all research outputs scored by Altmetric (jamanetwork.altmetric.com/details/127613924).

Another highlight was our collaboration with George Washington University's Perinatal COVID-19 Sequential Prospective Meta-Analysis Project. This international collaboration involved more than 100 investigators and stakeholders working in 41 countries. Our Canadian data on COVID-19 in pregnancy and the postpartum period were used in two publications with this group.

Conferences

Following the changes made as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the RID team adapted to both in-person and online conferences over the year. This hybrid arrangement allowed our investigators to submit 13 different oral and poster presentations at 6 conferences.

A highlight of our conference season was the Annual Meeting of the Infectious Diseases Society for Obstetrics and Gynecology (IDSOG), in August of this year. Drs. Sarah Mohn, Chelsea Elwood, Andrea Atkinson, Deborah Money, and Elisabeth McClymont (pictured below) represented the RID team in Boston, Massachusetts. There, they kept busy with **six presentations**: three which covered our three COVID-19 research projects, one on Maternal and Infant CMV detection in Women Living with HIV, one on the Vaginal Microbiome and Infant Gut Microbiome, and one on Penicillin Allergy De-labelling in Pregnancy.



Grants and Funding





We would like to extend our immense gratitude to the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) and their COVID-19 Immunity Task Force (CITF) for their ongoing COVID-19 research funding. Their generous grants of over \$7 million have been the key to our COVID-19 research success.

RID investigators were funded by a total of 23 grants this year. Sixteen of these were ongoing from previous years, and seven were newly awarded. Funding from the seven grants received in 2022 totaled **over 2.7 million dollars,** allowing us to begin new projects and continue with much of our ongoing research.



Another highlight of 2022 came with the CIHR Spring Project Grant announcements. Our study, titled "A Study of Reduced Dosing of the Nonavalent HPV Vaccine in Women Living with HIV", was awarded 1.6 million dollars for five years. This funding will allow us to conduct this phase IV clinical trial and continue to build upon our previous HPV in HIV research.


Presentations

RID investigators were involved in numerous education sessions, research rounds, keynote and plenary addresses, and media interviews over the year. Prioritizing knowledge translation with both scientific and lay communities has allowed us to share our findings, aid in the creation of public health policy, and fight against misinformation. Dr. Deborah Money was invited to be part of 2 working groups for the National Advisory Committee for Immunizations (NACI). Her involvement in the the Influenza Vaccine in Pregnancy Working Group and the COVID-19 Vaccine in Pregnancy Working Group will influence these recommendations for the pregnant population.



A highlight of our knowledge translation activities this year was Dr. Deborah Money's interview with UBC Media Relations, titled "Bivalent vaccines are here: what it means for people who are pregnant". This interview generated very positive and sustained web traffic, which was driven mostly by Google searches from the public. **The Q&A was one of the top 3 most viewed stories through UBC Media Relations** for over a month following its

publication. Additionally, the interview was featured by Google at the top of search results following the notable public interest.



In March, the International Federation of Gynecology and Obstetrics (FIGO) released a webinar titled "COVID during pregnancy: an update", wherein five experts gathered to discuss the epidemiological, clinical and obstetrical outcomes of SARS-CoV-2 in pregnancy, and the impact of vaccination for pregnant people worldwide. **This international webinar featured a presentation by Dr. Deborah Money**, where she shared insight from our Canadian CANCOVID-Preg Surveillance Program. Dr. Money's presentation was shared alongside those from her expert counterparts in Germany, Malaysia, Lebanon, and Brazil.

Awards

In June, Dr. Deborah Money was the **plenary speaker** at the SOGC's Annual Clinical and Scientific Conference. Her presentation, titled "Reproductive Infectious Diseases (RID) Research Program" provided an overview of many of the projects that the RID team has been involved in over the recent years. Following her presentation, she was presented with the Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of Canada (SOGC) **2022 Excellence in Research Award.** The Excellence in Research Award recognizes outstanding scientific leadership, research mentoring, creative effort and major research accomplishments of a Canadian researcher.
